



3. Focus – Be relentlessly focused on the big rocks you are trying to move. It is easy to get sidetracked.



The Power of Vision Clarity

- Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I ٠ have given you, as I said to Moses. No man shall be able to stand before you all the days of your life; as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave you nor forsake you. <u>Be strong and of good courage</u>, for to this people you shall divide as an inheritance the land which I swore to their fathers to give them. <u>Only be strong and very courageous</u>, that you may observe to do according to all the law which Moses My servant commanded you; do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, that you may prosper wherever you go. This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success. <u>Have I not commanded you? Be</u> strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever <u>you go</u>." (Joshua 1:4-9)

Only the LORD your God be with you, as He was with Moses. Rebuild Relational Trust

The longer your organization exists, increases the likelihood that trust has been broken on some level in the past.

Trust influences us every moment of every day. Trust impacts the quality of our relationships, the value of our work and the health of our churches.

When there is trust in our relationships, we have confidence that we cherish the same things. When trust is absent, we tend to be suspicious of each other's agendas. When trust is present there is an assured reliance on the character of others. When trust is lacking, we are wary of one another's words, actions and motives.

Trust is seen through one's character (the work of God in one's soul) **and it is felt through the competence of our work** (the ability to see God in your ministry). Trust is experienced through the consistency of our character and through the ability of our ministries to deliver what we promise.






A Long -Term Investment in the Harvest is Critical

#**4** Pray for "Strategic Victories" Joshua experienced two key victories

1. Crossing the Jordan (Joshua 3:14-17)

#**4** Pray for "Strategic Victories" Pray for Strategic Victories

1. Pray for key churches to be involved in funding, parenting and adopting new church planters.

2. Pray for key locations to be determined: underserved areas as well as high growth areas, people groups and educational communities.

3. Pray that "Anchor churches" will be established in new areas.

Strategy victories replace a defeatist attitude, and they are built out of spiritual momentum.

#**4** Pray for "Strategic Victories"

Why is Spiritual Momentum so Important?

Momentum...it's God's work. Spiritual leaders can neither create a movement of God's Spirit nor control it. But a leader should build an atmosphere charged with a desire for spiritual momentum.

Momentum...it's a sacred trust. Spiritual leaders have the responsibility to sense where God is leading and to mobilize His people to follow.


#5 Embrace your "Antioch Moments"

What is an Antioch Moment?

We find this principle in Acts 13:1-3. Where we discover the leaders of the church in Antioch gathering for **worship**, **prayer**, **and a season of fasting** as they sought God's answer to this question: "Lord what is our next step?" This thriving community of faith was a multi-cultural church impacting this secular city with great favor from God. Luke describes it this way, "The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord" (Acts 11:21). These leaders were seeking God's divine direction so that they would continue to be right in the midst of God's redemptive mission.

Every church and mission organization will come to a moment where they need divine insight collectively among their leaders. Insight on the critical decisions that will keep them vibrantly engaged in God's unfolding mission.
